Melbourne Rudolf Steiner School is a K-12 co-educational, non-denominational school located in the eastern suburb of Warranwood. We are seeking an experienced and enthusiastic Violin and Viola Tutor for a fixed-term, part-time position to cover Long Service Leave during Term 4 of 2025. The role involves working approximately two to three days per week, between 10:15am and 4:00pm, from the week beginning 6th October to 12th December 2025 inclusive.

The successful applicant will be qualified in music performance, with the ability to instill a love for instrumental music in the primary-aged child and the experience and technical proficiency to prepare students for VCE Music Performance examinations. Also desirable is experience in conducting class orchestras and small ensembles in a variety of musical styles.

Our music program currently has six orchestras, contemporary bands, a cappella ensembles, world/folk ensembles, and other smaller groups rehearsing each week together. The successful applicant would be joining a wonderful team of over fifteen music teachers/instructors.

- Attendance days are currently Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, but this is flexible for the right candidate.
- Deliver high-quality individual violin and viola lessons to primary and secondary students.
- Ability to facilitate and direct Class Orchestras and small chamber ensembles.
- Attendance at occasional school concerts, soirees, Fair Day and recitals is a requirement of the role and inclusive within the teaching load.

Key Responsibilities:

- Teach individual violin and viola students from beginner to advanced levels.
- Liaise with student families regarding lesson scheduling as needed.
- Contribute positively and collegially to our Instrumental Music team.
- Use school systems and relevant digital tools effectively (e.g. Engage, Google Suite).
- Experience in Steiner Education or an understanding of Steiner pedagogy is an advantage.
- End of Semester reports for secondary students.

Requirements:

- Bachelor of Music or equivalent in violin/viola performance.
- Current Working With Children Check (WWCC) or VIT registration.
- A sound understanding of and commitment to current Child Safety Standards.
- The right to work in Australia.
- All short-listed candidates will be expected to play one solo work in the interview.
