About this Role:

We are looking for a warm, flexible and enthusiastic person who loves children and is deeply interested in the domestic activity surrounding early childhood, such as cooking, gardening, music, storytelling and hand-crafts. Someone who is interested in Anthroposophy and ongoing self-development and has knowledge of Steiner Education will also be highly regarded.

Ideally, the person will have prior experience in a Steiner early childhood environment and/or early childhood training in Steiner Education.

The co-educator is a vital role to play in the Kindergarten program and is a valued team member. Not only is the co-educator a support for the teacher but an integral of holding an accompanying the children during their time at Kindergarten.

- Certificate III in Early Childhood Education and Care or equivalent
- Current First Aid Certificate (including HLTAID004 Provide an emergency first aid response in an education and care setting)
- Current First Aid Management of Anaphylaxis & Asthma Certificate
