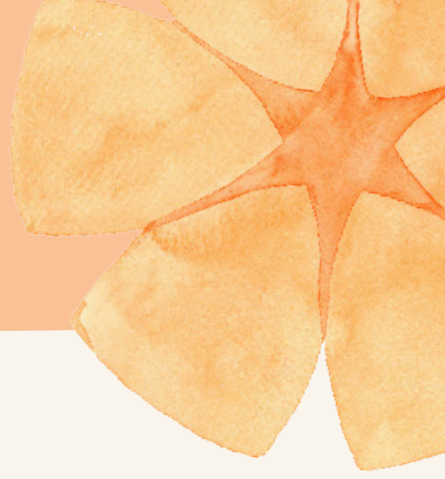
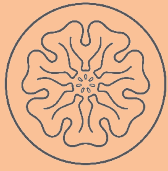




PRIMARY HANDCRAFT SPECIALIST TEACHER
